




Equity Assurance Panels

Educators will review exam materials for potential sources of bias according to established review criteria pertaining to exam content, language, offensiveness, and stereotypes.






Content Advisory Committees

- Content Advisory Committee members may also assist TEA in other development activities.






Marker Selection

- Content Advisory Committee
 members convene to review and
 approve exemplary responses to
 constructed-response questions from
 a pilot test.
- These responses will serve as "scorepoint markers" for training scorers to accurately score the responses submitted by candidates.





Standard Setting

Content Advisory Committee members participate in a process of making judgments and recommendations regarding a passing score for the exam to the Texas Commissioner of Education.



Holistic Scoring



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Holistic Scoring Overview

All scorers are local to Texas.

Scorers are trained and calibrated in Pearson's proprietary **Focused Holistic Scoring** process, prior to scoring candidate responses, during each scoring session.

Focused Holistic Scoring — judging the overall effectiveness of each response while focusing on a set of performance descriptions and 4-point score scales contained in the rubrics.

Scorers use the rubrics in conjunction with **marker responses**, chosen by committee, which represent each of the score scale points on the rubric.

Process for Requesting Arrangements

1. Review
"Documentation
Requirements"
and collect necessary
documents.**

2. Register for the test.

Declare intent to request alternative testing arrangements.

3. DO NOT schedule test appointment yet.

4. Submit Alternative Testing Arrangements Request Form with each registration.

5. Check email for notification of resolution.

Resolution is typically within three weeks.

Check spam folder.


6. Follow instructions provided in the resolution email to schedule appointment.

** Documentation is submitted with first request <u>only</u> unless there is a change in the condition or the arrangements requested.

Submitting an Appeal

- Candidates may appeal the denial of some or all of their requests.
- First, review the "Documentation Requirements" again.

- The appeal must be submitted within 30 days after receipt of the notification of denial.
- An appeal may take up to 30 calendar days to resolve.

INCLUDE:

- ✓ Name, address, candidate ID number
- ✓ Date of the appeal
- ✓ Additional documentation that supports the request

INCLUDE:

- ✓ Brief summary of why the request should be granted
- ✓ Candidate's signature on the appeal
